Ellen (Nellie), who was a great favourite with her Irish cousins; she is quoted as saying that they 'would pick her up and run round the room with her at grand functions long after they were grown up'. There is an odd story concerning her and my father, when they were both children, but he six years older than she, on some occasion when they had both been left behind at Milfort, with only servants to look after them, who dressed them up, and performed a mock wedding ceremony between them. The incident is said to have left a deep impression on Nellie, as well it might. On 11.2.1898, at the age of 24, she married Edward Dickenson. Their elder son was named Cecil, whose widow Ann gave much help in providing material for these notes, as did also her brother-in-law, Edward, the Colonel Dickenson mentioned earlier, who liveslived in Westmorland and would have been High Sheriff of the county if ill-health had not caused him to refuse the honour; he married his second cousin Stella Murgatroyd, daughter of John Murgatroyd and granddaughter of Annie Hodgson who caused her sister the embarrassment over the engagement ring. Neither of the brothers had any children. My father assisted at Edward's marriage, performed by the Bishop of Wakefield.

Next we have Catherine (Kate) Morley who, after a gay youth surrounded by officers of the Duke of Wellington's Regiment quartered at the Halifax barracks, never married any of them, but went off to Bordeaux where she lived for years with an English family she 'adopted' there. Her life was rather disapproved of, but it seems to have been a happy one, and she died as she had lived, independent and beholden to no one.

This Jonathan, a man of wide reading and self-education, became a surgeon at Blackburn and died on 27.4.1862 (estate valued at under £4000) at Lytham, where his wife Priscilla, who came from Northumberland, also died on 2.3.1870.
